This summer the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL) approved the creation of a Working Group on Global Online Dispute Resolution. The first meeting of this new Working Group will take place at the UN in Vienna this December.

To prepare a group of leading organizations in law, technology and conflict resolution are hosting a two-day conference to review the proposed design for this global resolution system and learn about how it might affect private companies, legal practitioners, and global consumer rights.
